




Research on the Reality of Consolidation COSTS ARE NOT REDUCED

- REPORT FOR NEW JERSEY GOVERNMENT BY RUTGERS UNIVERSITY:
 - cost savings are not assured
- REPORT FOR THE MICHIGAN SENATE:
 - there is no clear relationship between spending per person and total number of local governments or number of persons per local government
- FEDERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS:
 - There is general agreement that consolidation has not reduced costs (as indicated by some reform advocates) and, in fact, may have even increased total local expenditures



Local Government Expenditures in Ohio DIRECT GENERAL EXPENDITURES: 2007









Elinor Ostrum, 2009 Nobel Prize Lecture (Economics)

Scholars criticized the number of government agencies rather than trying to understand why created and how they performed. Maps showing many governments in a metropolitan area were used as evidence for the need to consolidate.

Small to medium-sized cities are more effective monitors of performance and costs.








DEBT SERVICE/CAPITA: 2008






% OF GOVERNMENTS WITH DEBT PAYMENTS: 2008














Ohio Townships Spend Less CURRENT EXPENDITURES/CAPITA: 2008


Townships Spend Less: Metro Areas CURRENT EXPENDITURES/CAPITA: 2008







Ohio Townships Tax Less 2007: PER CAPITA





Townships have Lower Labor Costs

OHIO: 2007: PER CAPITA WAGE COSTS




Labor is More Costly than Capital UNITED STATES LOCAL GOVERNMENTS: 2007






Townships are Rarely in Fiscal Distress SHARE OF POPULATION BY SIZE: SINCE 1997




Entered Fiscal Distress Since 1997: Share of Population in Each Category














Claim: Fire Protection More Costly REALITY: FIRE COSTS ARE LESS






Township Fire Expenditures are Less




















1984-2009 BY GOVERNMENTS PER 100,000 POPULATION




People are Moving to Townships CITIES, VILLAGES & TOWNSHIPS: 2000-2010
