Her contributions and services to the township include:

- Zoning Secretary from 1968 1970
- Clerk from 1970 1987
- Helped to form the Russell Park District in 1984
- Land Conservancy Trustee from 1988 1994
- Historical Society President from 1989 1995
- Editor of the Russell Historical Society Newsletter from 1989 2010
- Women's Club President from 2003 2004

Other services and contributions to the township include:

- One of the original founders of the Historical Society, and was an active member
- Did most of the research and collection of information on Russell and the early pioneers and kept the Historical Society going for many years.
- Set up School Feasibility study for the Save Russell School project
- Organized funding from Historical Society members for the Save Russell School project
- Being a major donor to the Russell School Fund
- Wrote letters to various organizations to survey the school for restoration
- A member of the Women's Club
- The prime contributor to the writing and assembly of the book "A Pictorial History of Russell Township"
- Involved with the Park District for many years and helped in preserving the green and open space in the township
- Writing some of the Townships first computer programs
